Local League Convenor - John Seney

Officially there are no details to report from the LL Convenor position over the past year due to the limited hockey opportunity we had however I am very proud of EMHA, it's members and the players for putting together a shortened but engaging hockey season. I felt that as a whole, the organization made the most of what could be done based on the limitations placed on us because of Covid restrictions. Going forward, we are hopeful and planning to have a full year of EMHA hockey season and I look forward to seeing everyone at the rink again soon.

Registrar's Report - Sherry Hall

To begin the 2020/2021 hockey season, EMHA transitioned to online registration, with the opportunity for families to pay by etransfer, as well as cash or cheque. Online registration worked extremely well and gave members the chance to register their players from the comfort of their own home, at a time that was convenient for them. We will be continuing with online registration again this year.

While the 2020/2021 hockey season looked very different from a typical year, Elmvale Minor Hockey had 193 families who registered their children to participate in our programming. Due to Covid and many of our previous players still in the local area, we offered a U21 program as well (which was cut short due to rising Covid cases and a stay at home order). We had 34 players in U7, 36 players in U9, 47 registered in U11, 43 players in U13, 38 players in U15, 46 players registered in U18, and 10 players in U21 for a total of 254 members. While this was down from our previous 310 registrations in 2019-2020, given the circumstances of covid restrictions and the programming we were able to offer, we were pleased with the number of players we had

registered. We were unable to provide a preschool program this year, but look forward to welcoming our youngest players back to the ice in the upcoming season.

Our programming was limited to offering practices and house league games (made up of teams of a maximum of ten players) this year as a result of OMHA return to play guidelines. We rostered 4 U7 teams, 4 U9 teams, 5 U11 teams, 4 U13 teams, 4 U15 teams, 5 U18 teams, and 1 U21 team.

We look forward to opening up our online registration on June 15th and are excited to welcome our members back to EMHA for what will hopefully be a 'regular' hockey season. Information regarding the registration process, fees, volunteering requirements, as well as fundraising information will be updated on our website, under the 'registration' tab shortly.

Director - Game Day Operations - Mike Kelly

Volunteer Manager 2020/2021 Report - Melissa Peterson

This was my first season as acting Volunteer Manager for EMHA, and my first year on the Executive. Although, I am not new to the EMHA volunteer role, as I have run our annual KICX dance for several years. The Dance was just not possible this past season, but I do look forward to its return in the coming years.

My roll this season was to coordinate volunteers as required for various EMHA events. In October we had to arrange for Covid Screening Checks and this required volunteers to check in each team at the door prior to ice times. This was new to all of us, but after a few weeks it became habit for the players, and much smoother check ins at the door.

We are planning our annual golf tournament this summer, tentatively book for the end of June, where we will be looking to fill some volunteer rolls again. The tournament will have a bit of a different spin this year, but like everything else these days, we will just roll with the punches

EMHA Sponsorship and Publicity Report - Angela Birch

While it is normally the role of the Sponsorship and Publicity Director to establish team sponsorship for all teams within Elmvale Minor Hockey, this became problematic in 2020-2021 due to the nature of the Covid-19 pandemic. An executive decision was made to refrain from asking local business for sponsorship funds for a number of reasons. Firstly, it was felt that many of our local businesses were not in a financial position to donate funds as they were addressing their own financial challenges. In addition, we were not able to outline what we could offer to our sponsors as we were unable to play games or have spectators that would provide exposure to these businesses and our team structure, when we could play, was far different from the tiered structure of representative, alternate entry, and local league we had offered in the past. Despite this, we did receive a regular sponsorship donation from one sponsor, CEC Services, for which we extend our gratitude. While this presented a challenge for Elmvale Minor Hockey, one step taken to address this loss was to approach Springwater Council with a delegation to request a decrease in ice rental fees for the season. This delegation was prepared by a few executive members and presented to council at a virtual meeting. The motion was passed and Elmvale Minor Hockey received a reduced rental rate that was in line with what would normally be the cost of "non-prime" youth hourly rental fees. This equated to a \$135.22 plus tax per rental hour consistent charge which normally fluctuates based on time of use. The annual picture night did not take place during this season and we hope to resume this tradition for the 2021-2022 season. We also hope to have a more regular season structure and to return to the partnership with our local businesses that has been so successful in the past. If you are a business owner interested in sponsoring a team within our organization, please reach out at any time as we welcome new sponsors as part of our EMHA family. I will not be continuing in this role for the coming season. I do have a Google Drive collection of files that will be shared with my successor and I will be happy to assist and answer any questions for anyone considering taking on this important role.

Equipment Manager - James Elliot

To say that it was a different season last year is an understatement. Normally the locker room would start the season with team being assigned lockers to use throughout the season. With protocols in place and limited access to the lockers it was decided to hand out jerseys to be used for the duration of our in house schedule. This in conjunction with a quick shut down has left several jerseys uncollected. There will be a date setup to drop these off once restrictions allows. It was, and continues to be a challenge at all levels of this organization to make hockey available to our kids. This past season proved to be a challenge for everyone within the EMHA and I'd like to thank everyone here for the continued support while work through this.

With Health unit restrictions in place, EMHA was forced to be creative in regards to how we got our players back on the ice. I feel the tiered groups for practices and combined groups for games worked extremely well and everyone appeared to be having fun. Unfortunately due to our restrictions we didn't have the ability to run extra development sessions for players or goalies, but hopefully this will change in the coming season. With these restrictions, we were
